Dear Families,

Further to my earlier communication on 2nd April I wish to let you know that our situation in Cheeverstown has evolved and we now have a small number of confirmed Covid-19 cases among the people we support on campus and a further number of people who, although not confirmed as positive, are nonetheless displaying some of the symptoms for whom we have increased their levels of observation and support. We are also following the advice we receive on a regular basis from the HSE and the Health Prevention Surveillance Centre, HPSC.

We continue to link with the families of people supported by Cheeverstown who are now living at home. Please contact your manager or social worker if you have any concerns.

We are in the process of establishing activities such as bingo, exercise classes and live music for people living at home through 'Cheeverstown Social Group' on Facebook and we will be inviting families to join this group shortly.

Please remember if your family member is showing any symptoms please contact your GP and also inform the manager of your service.

We fully appreciate these are difficult and worrying times for you, your family member and our staff. We thank you for your understanding and support as we continue to combat the challenges that COVID 19 brings.

Please stay safe and continue to follow the guidelines issued by the Government.
